

The Emory Addiction Services at Emory University/Emory School of Medicine is seeking applicants for a full-time Clinical Research Coordinator position. The position requires a two-year commitment starting summer 2019. Under the direction of Dr. Justine Welsh, the Emory Addiction Services' research examines treatment outcomes in adolescents and young adults with substance use disorders. Current grant-funded studies for the position include an adaptation of a young adult women's substance use group therapy, and an evaluation of a specific behavioral intervention to medication-assisted treatment in individuals with severe opioid use disorder. The individual in this position is responsible for managing an active research lab with multiple adolescent and young adult treatment studies, as well as aiding in the administration of the addiction clinic. Research responsibilities include participant recruitment, creation of study materials, data collection and management, study scheduling, clinical interviewing, and preparation of IRB materials. Other tasks include preparing scientific presentations and manuscripts, conducting literature searches, and sitting-in on clinical team meetings. Applicants should have some experience in conducting literature searches, creating excel spreadsheets, and working as part of a team.

Qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree
- At least one year of laboratory or clinical research experience while as an undergraduate
- Preference given to those with previous experience working with adolescents and young adults in a clinical or research setting
- Preference given to those with experience in statistical software (e.g. SPSS or R) and scientific writing
- Strong organizational skills and an ability to work independently
- A strong interest in a future career in medicine or clinical psychology. This position is particularly suitable to post-bachelor student looking to go to medical school or graduate school.
