

Instructions for Cognitive Science Track Application

Mind/Brain/Behavior Track in Psychology

Statement of Purpose: Attach a one-to-two-page statement that explains your interests in Psychology and in Mind/Brain/Behavior, and how your selection of courses supports your specific intellectual interests in a coherent way.

Plan of Study: Complete the plan of study portion of the application. If any of your choices deviate from the requirements (e.g., substitution, fulfilling requirement late), attach an additional statement explaining the change. Be sure to include at least one advanced course from another area of MBB. If you are petitioning to include a course not on the approved course lists, also attach a course syllabus.

Concentration Advisor Approval: This signature signifies you and your CA have reviewed your application together.

Faculty Approval: You must receive the approval of an assistant, associate, or full professor in the department, whose signature attests that your proposed program of study is both feasible and intellectually coherent.

Submission: Submit two copies of your complete application (including any attachments) to the Psychology Undergraduate Office (William James 218). Also save a copy for yourself.

Deadlines: We review MBB applications twice yearly. The Fall deadline is November 1st. The Spring deadline is April 1st. You must submit an application no later than the first semester of your junior year, but may submit it earlier if you wish.

After Submission: Your application will be reviewed by the department, and we will e-mail you a decision on it.
