Description:

The primary goal of our research is to advance the understanding of why people engage in behaviors that are harmful to themselves, with a special emphasis on suicide, self-injury, and other forms of direct self-harm. Our research is multi-disciplinary and uses a range of methodological approaches to better understand how these behaviors develop, how to predict their occurrence, and ultimately how to prevent them.

This semester, we have openings on at least five research projects, including but not limited to a study on behavioral and physiological predictors of suicidal behaviors in adolescents, psychological pain and time perception, and a lab-based study examining suicide related cognition in Veterans.
