The Automaticity in Cognition, Motivation, and Evaluation Lab at Yale University is currently accepting applications for volunteer research assistants this summer (early June - mid-August). The ideal candidate is a motivated undergraduate or recent graduate with a keen interest in social psychology. Research experience is an asset but not a necessity. Research topics relate to shared experience, shared reality, social media, and self-perception. Interns will work closely with graduate students on new and ongoing studies. Interns are expected to work approximately 35 hours/week, and duties include all facets of research -- study preparation, data collection (in the field, in the lab, or online), supervised data analysis, and exposure to lab procedure (e.g. IRB protocols, research write-ups, etc.).
