

Lab Manager at Indiana University Bloomington

As of 4/24/2023, the [Clinical and Cognitive Neuroscience Center](#) (CCNC) seeks a new full-time paid Laboratory Manager to assist in the day-to-day activities of studies that examine cognitive, affective, and physiological processes in clinical psychopathology and community samples. The CCNC focuses on the psychosis spectrum, but also has studies on the autism spectrum, cannabis use, and other groups. Additionally, the role of adversity and trauma in these psychopathology spectra is a growing interest in the lab. The center is within the [Department of Psychological and Brain Sciences](#) at Indiana University Bloomington and is led by Drs. Krista Wisner, Alexandra Moussa-Tooks, & William Hetrick.

Primary responsibilities of the CCNC Lab Manager includes recruiting participants, assessing symptoms and cognition, running participants through experimental paradigms and/or neuroimaging protocols, as well as maintaining research databases and IRB protocols. The successful applicant will join our vibrant and versatile lab team to help conduct investigations of cortical and cerebellar contributions to behavioral alterations in cognitive and affective processes (e.g., social decision-making, stress reactivity, interoception, proprioception, motor coordination, learning and memory). Methodologies currently employed include self-reports, interviews, cognitive testing, behavioral and motor tasks, psychophysiology, and magnetic resonance imaging (structural MRI, functional MRI, diffusion-weighted imaging, resting state functional connectivity, and magnetic resonance spectroscopy).

This position is ideal for candidates interested in gaining hands-on experience and professional development before pursuing doctoral training in psychology, medicine, neuroscience, or a related field. *The ideal applicant will have some prior exposure to clinical psychopathology, some prior experience with research, as well as be willing to commit to two years of employment in this position.* The CCNC recognizes that scientific excellence is dependent on the diversity of the team, broadly construed, and therefore strongly welcomes applicants from individuals who add to the diversity of the CCNC. The College of Arts and Sciences also values diversity, equity, and inclusion as a core strength and essential element in the success of its educational mission.
