

Dr. Anne Berry's laboratory in the Psychology Department at Brandeis University is looking for a full-time research assistant to work on human studies of cognitive aging. The research assistant will take part in neuropsychological testing and data collection, with opportunities to train in brain imaging data collection. The research assistant will also participate in weekly lab meetings, and will be responsible for various participant-facing tasks with opportunities to learn about study coordination. This position is ideal for someone interested in pursuing a career in research or medicine.

Applicants should have 1) an undergraduate degree in psychology, neuroscience or related field 2) prior research experience 3) attention to detail and strong communication skills 4) good "bedside manner" and interest in older adult populations. Ideally, candidates will have prior experience with behavioral testing in humans.

Expected commitment for this position is 2 years, but the position may be extended.
