

Study Coordinator in the Eating Anxiety & Treatment Lab at the University of Louisville

The Eating Anxiety & Treatment Lab at the University of Louisville is hiring a full-time **Study Coordinator** for a large randomized controlled trial on digital treatment for eating disorders!

This position is ideal for someone interested in pursuing graduate study in clinical/health psychology. In addition to gaining fundamental research experience and skills, there are ample professional development opportunities and mentorship available. Most of our coordinators successfully transition to graduate school for clinical/health psychology or related fields.

The coordinator will assist with two large randomized controlled trials:

- **Personalized Interventions and Outcomes: Navigating Eating Disorder Experiences and Recovery (PIONEER) Study.** This study is working to build a new precision treatment for eating disorders and identify how individual treatment mechanisms relate to public health outcomes, individual disease burden, medical comorbidities, and social determinants of health.
- **A Randomized Controlled Trial of Digital Written Exposure Therapy for Eating Disorders: Improving Access to Care.** This project will test a digital, self-guided treatment for eating disorders. The goal is to establish it as an evidence-based, widely accessible intervention that can improve outcomes and reduce the overall burden of eating disorders.

Duties include communicating with clinic research sites, communicating with participants over email, in person and over the phone, assisting with project design and organization, assisting with data collection in the lab, online, and in the clinic, assisting with grant applications, entering and coding data, supervising undergraduate and graduate assistants, maintaining databases, purchasing supplies, and general organizational activities.

Interest in psychological research, experiences working with clinical populations, strong technical and computer skills, and a commitment of at least 2 year (extendable depending on fit and availability of funding). We are especially interested in applicants who are sociable, self-motivated, organized, detail-oriented, and able to work independently and as part of a team.

Ideal candidates:

- Bachelor's in psychology or related field
- Prior research experience (required)
- Strong organization, communication, and technical skills (SPSS, REDCap, etc.)
