

## Research Coordinator at the University of Oregon

Seeking to hire a full-time Research Coordinator to begin in Fall 2026. This is an in-person position - but a hybrid or remote arrangement may be considered for exceptionally qualified candidates, depending on experience and project needs. The coordinator will oversee a NIH-funded ([1R34MH140927](#)) pilot randomized clinical trial, which is testing an evidence-based treatment augmented with cultural adaptations for Latino youth and families.

### **Position Overview**

The Research Coordinator will manage day-to-day operations of the clinical trial. Responsibilities include (but are not limited to):

- Consenting English- and Spanish-speaking participants
- Compensating participants
- Monitoring and managing data collection
- Preparing IRB applications and modifications
- Attending and taking notes at meetings with community partners

There will also be opportunities to contribute to conference presentations and peer-reviewed publications.

### **Qualifications**

#### ***Required:***

- Bachelor's degree in Psychology or a related field by Fall 2026
- Bilingual in English and Spanish (fluent verbal and written communication in both languages)

#### ***Preferred:***

- At least one year of research experience in clinical or developmental psychology

This is an excellent position for individuals planning to apply to doctoral programs in clinical or counseling psychology, particularly those interested in mental health disparities, implementation science, and/or community-engaged research.
