Position Requirements Include:

- Two-year commitment
- At least 1 year of experience
- Bachelor's or Master's Degree
- Familiarity working with human subjects and with experimental research

Provides expertise in support of physical or mental health research projects. Typically works out of a clinic or other health care facility and may travel to homes, schools or residential facilities to collect data. Performs advanced testing procedures, data collection, and analysis. Typically works directly with human subjects. Ensures experiments are performed according to specifications. May make recommendations to changes in procedure, processes, or experimental design. May prepare and/or edit research papers, grant proposals and reports.

Strong writing, analytical, organizational, and problem-solving skills are essential, along with the ability to manage multiple priorities in a fast-paced and collaborative research environment. This position is particularly well suited for individuals interested in pursuing a Ph.D. in Clinical Psychology, Counseling Psychology, Health Psychology, or a related field.

Primary Responsibilities Include:

- Leading participant recruitment and community outreach efforts
- Coordinating study activities and data collection across multiple ongoing projects
- Supervising and mentoring undergraduate research assistants
- Supporting the successful execution of grant-funded studies in collaboration with investigators, research staff, and community partners
- Receives direct supervision but is expected to learn how to select from a variety of standard procedures to complete tasks
