

Research Volunteer in the Pediatric Anxiety Research Center (PARC) at Bradley
Hospital/Brown University

The Pediatric Anxiety Research Center (PARC) at Bradley Hospital/The Warren Alpert Medical School of Brown University has in-person volunteer positions for motivated college undergraduates or others with an interest in research and psychology. Current studies at PARC include examining effective treatments such as cognitive behavioral therapy and exposure therapy for children and adolescents with anxiety disorders and OCD. Primary volunteer responsibilities include, but are not limited to, data entry, the preparation and storage of weekly therapy documents, assembling diagnostic assessment tools, reviewing clinical assessments, and assisting with various research and administrative tasks as they arise. There is the opportunity to attend clinical and research meetings and participate in multidisciplinary discussions with research assistants and PARC faculty. A qualified student will have excellent organization skills, attention to detail, strong communication skills, and an interest in clinical research. Relevant previous work or classroom experience is helpful. Students are expected to commit meaningful time to the volunteer position, a minimum of 6 hours per week for at least one semester (Fall or Spring) or 10 hours per week for Summer. Past clinical research volunteers have received independent study credit or applied for outside funding to support their time at PARC, and we are happy to provide any feedback or documentation necessary for eligible students. Transportation to and from Bradley Hospital will be necessary to attend the job. Applications are reviewed on a rolling basis.
