Position Summary Information

Primary Purpose of Organizational Unit	<p>The TEACCH Autism Program began in 1972 as a system of university-based regional centers to serve children, adolescents and adults with Autism Spectrum Disorder and their families. As part of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, the program has an active clinical, teaching, and research program. TEACCH operates seven community regional clinics across the state. Each center offers a set of core services along with unique demonstration programs meeting the needs of individuals with ASD, their families, and professionals across the state of North Carolina. Also, part of TEACCH are the Carolina Living and Learning Center, a residential/vocational training facility for adults with autism as well as an Employment Services program providing Job Coaching and related services to adults with autism.</p> <p>TEACCH is part of the University of North Carolina School of Medicine under the North Carolina Area Health Education Centers (AHEC) program and faculty are actively involved in student and professional training activities within the state, nation, and across the world. All TEACCH programs are coordinated through a central administration and research unit in Chapel Hill, North Carolina. TEACCH provides clinical services such as diagnostic evaluations, parent</p>
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coaching and parent support groups, early intervention services, individual and group mental health counseling for individuals with ASD, and supported employment. In addition, TEACCH conducts training nationally and internationally and provides consultation for teachers, residential care providers, and other professionals from a variety of disciplines. Research activities include psychological, educational, and biomedical studies with a focus on community implementation of evidence-based practices.

Position Summary	This position involves assisting in research activities focused on the translation or implementation of evidence-based practices to community settings. Fifty percent of this position will involve working on a clinical trial examining the effectiveness of the TEACCH School Transition to Employment and Postsecondary Education (T-STEP)program for high school and college students with Autism Spectrum Disorder. The other fifty percent of this project will involve research on the effectiveness of 1) mental health interventions for individuals with autism and co-occurring psychiatric conditions, and 2)the associated implementation strategies. Activities for all areas of research will involve assisting project coordinators with participant recruitment, conducting assessments around the state of North Carolina, data collection and entry, and preparation of research presentations and manuscripts.
Minimum Education and Experience Requirements	Bachelor's degree; or equivalent combination of training and experience. All degrees must be received from appropriately accredited institutions.
Required Qualifications, Competencies, and Experience	The selected candidate will have excellent communication skills and the ability to successfully work as a collaborative team member. The position requires ability to carry out research activities (data collection, data analysis, participant recruitment) with supervision, meticulous attention to detail, and strong phone and interview skills. Must have knowledge and experience with Microsoft Office suite applications.
Preferred Qualifications, Competencies, and Experience	The department has a preference for a candidate with experience in developmental or clinical research, survey software and statistical package software, and some previous understanding/experience working with individuals with autism and/or other developmental disabilities.
