- **Prof. Mahzarin Banaji will be giving the Mind Brain Behavior Distinguished Harvard Lecture on Monday, Feb. 9 at 5pm, Title: Group Love, Yenching Auditorium, 2 Divinity Ave.**
 - From the moment of birth, every human is a member of many groups. By the opportunities and liberties offered or snatched away, group memberships shape lives ubiquitously and enduringly. Group memberships create affiliations of “us” and “them” and sensitivity to status in social hierarchies. Human minds reflect these in myriad attitudes and beliefs, which contain deep knowledge about the hidden presence of group love, its surprising absence, and its opposite. Unveiling them, through a diversity of methods available to experimental psychology, allows understanding the natural and cultivated ways in which group love is elusively tuned up and down.

You will need to apply to the program itself by their application deadline, as well as apply to Harvard for credit.
