This is a **part-time** 12+ hour/week **unpaid** position; however, there is a strong possibility that the position will become paid if you excel in this role. The position can be flexible in timing and scheduling. Candidates who commit more than 1 academic year will be prioritized. Boston College Sociology students can also use this position to receive credit for the Sociology Readings and Research course.

- Support with **document preparation** and formatting
- Use technology-based **research tools** (e.g., Zotero, Qualtrics)
- Conduct **literature reviews**
- Assist with **interviews/focus groups**

Strong RA Applicants will have:

- Strong **interest and experience** working in a research lab
- **Willingness to grow** and receive direct feedback
- **Time management** skills and the ability to communicate evolving priorities to larger team
- **Effective communication** skills
- Experience with critical thinking, **problem solving**, and independent learning
- **Strong interest** in working with LGBT+ youth, human-centered design methods, and/or macro social work
